

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY, T. 11 N., R. 43 E.

CHAINS	
17.80	Trail road, bears SE. and NW.
22.00	ShIPLEY Creek, 4 lks. wide, 4 ins. deep, course W., winding.
25.30	Trail road, bears NNE. and SSW.
39.59	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 12, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. T11N R43E R44E $\frac{1}{4}$ S 12 S 7 1967 raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.
64.00	Flood channel, 80 lks. wide, 4 ft. deep, drains W.
79.18	The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, monumented with the fragmented remains of a cottonwood post bearing indications of sharpening and squaring, lying on a dim mound of earth. This point is well related to other nearby recovered original corners on the township bdy. At the corner point Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. T11N R43E R44E S 1 S 6 S 12 S 7 1967 bury the remains of the wooden post alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor. Land, nearly level. Soil, clay sand. Undergrowth, sagebrush, shadscale and greasewood.
20.50	N. $5^{\circ} 04'$ E., bet. secs. 1 and 6. Over nearly level land draining W., through medium dense undergrowth. Dim track road, bears E. and W.
