T. 4 S., R. 63 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
Benson and Putnam, U. S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1881.

From the standard cor. of Tps. 4 S., Rs. 63 and 64 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

N. 0° 21' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over level land, through scattered Joshua trees and medium dense undergrowth.

40.40 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. The corner position is located in a bladed road, bearing ESE. and WNW.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 36 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
