<p>CHAINS</p>	<p>Land, level. Soil, clay, loam and gravel. Vegetation, sagebrush and greasewood.</p>
<p>41.59</p>	<p>From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8. N. 0° 47' W., bet. secs. 5 and 6. Over nearly level land, through scattered undergrowth. Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. <p>83.78</p>	<p>The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp. Land, level. Soil, clay, loam and gravel. Vegetation, sagebrush and greasewood.</p>
	<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>Township 4 South, Range 63 East, M.D.M., is located in the Delamar and Dry Lake Valleys. The elevation is about 4,800 ft. above sea level. The soil consists of clay, loam and gravel with some rock outcroppings. The vegetation is sagebrush, shadscale, greasewood and scattered Joshua trees. Access into the area is provided by U. S. Highway No. 93 and desert roads.</p> <p>No mineral formations were noted during the course of the survey.</p> <p>There is a small stockwater reservoir in section 20 and another in section 35. Water is supplied by run-off. No other water sources were noted.</p> <p>There are no settlements in the township.</p>
