

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES OF T. 36 N., R. 40 E.

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 36 North, Range 40 East, is mountainous in the eastern portion and nearly level in the western portion. The elevation ranges from about 4,330 to 5,960 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay and sandy clay loam on the lower elevations to sandy clay and rocky on the mountains. There are scattered willows along the Humboldt River. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, greasewood and sparse native grasses.

The township is drained by the Humboldt River which enters the township in section 25 and leaves in section 7. There have been considerable mining activities scattered throughout the mountains but none of these is operating at the present time.

The town of Golconda is located in sections 32 and 33. Access into the township is provided by Interstate Highway 80, State Highway No. 18, graded gravel roads and trail roads. The Southern Pacific and Western Pacific Railroads cross the township. Principal users of the area are cattlemen and farmers.
