	Over gently rolling land, through medium undergrowth; asc. 70 ft. over a SW. slope.
30.30	Trail road, bears ESE. and WNW.
30.80	Wash, 30 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, drains SW.; asc. 30 ft. over a SW. slope.
40.52	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
The area resurveyed within Township 37 North, Range 40 East, varies from nearly level land to mountainous in the southeast quarter of the Township. The elevation ranges from about 4,340 to 6,260 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay in the lower elevations to sandy clay and rocky in the mountains. The vegetation consists mostly of sagebrush and native grasses.	
The township drains in a southwesterly direction toward the Humboldt River. At the time of this survey there were no active mining operations, although there has been some prior mining activity.	
Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by a graded gravel road and trail roads.
