Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
N. L. Berdan, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1883.

Beginning the resurvey at the cor. of Tps. 2 and 3 N.,  
Rs. 48 and 49 E., monumented with the remains of a  
wooden post, loosely set in a small mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

reset the remains of the wooden post alongside the iron  
post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 3 ft. high,  
S. of cor.

N.  $89^{\circ} 03'$  W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over gently rolling land, through medium undergrowth;  
desc. over a gradual W. slope.

2.90 Trail road, bears NNE. and SSW.; desc. 70 ft. over a  
gradual W. slope.

32.00 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains NW. from ESE.;  
desc. over a gradual W. slope.

40.43 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at pro-  
portionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of  
the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
