GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 3 North, Range 48 East, which lies in Stone Cabin Valley varies from nearly level in the central portion to gently rolling in the east and west portions. The elevation ranges from about 5,600 to 6,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy to sandy clay loam. The north-central portion of the township is under cultivation and the remaining area has vegetation consisting of shadscale, budsage, sagebrush and sparse native grasses.

The area drains in a southerly direction through the central portion of the township. There are wells located in secs. 3 and 9. A house and spring is situated in sec. 6. A windmill is in sec. 32 and a water tank in sec. 26. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Access into the area is provided by U. S. Highway No. 6, crossing secs. 4, 5 and 6 in a west-southwesterly direction and a graded road crossing the township in a south-southwesterly direction and supplemented by numerous trail roads. Principal uses of the area are ranching and farming.
