DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY,  
T. 4 N., R. 48 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADAReestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
N. L. Berdan, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1883

Beginning the resurvey at the cor. of Tps. 3 and 4 N., Rs. 48 and 49 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 3 N., R. 48 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.

N. 0° 23' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over gently rolling land, sloping gradually W.; through medium undergrowth.

40.59 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

47.40 U. S. Highway No. 6, bears N. 80-¾° E. and S. 80-¾° W.

81.18 Point for the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
