From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 3 N., R. 48 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.

N. 0° 38' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through scant undergrowth.

29.80 Power line, parallels U. S. Highway No. 6.

33.10 U. S. Highway No. 6, bears N. 80-¾° E. and S. 80-¾° W.

40.91 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
