

## DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY, T. 1 N., R. 46 E.

CHAINS

deposit broken glass alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

79.90 The cor. of Tps. 1 and 2 N., Rs. 46 and 47 E., monumented with a sandstone, 6x5x3 ins., dimly mkd. with 6 notches on the S., E., W. and N. edges and firmly set 3 ins. in the ground.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

From the standard cor. of T. 1 N., Rs. 45 and 46 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the resurvey of the Mount Diablo Base Line, through Range 45 East, executed concurrently under this same Group.

N. 0° 49' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through medium undergrowth.

33.40 Trail road, bears ENE. and WSW.

40.28 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
