Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
A. Ludlum, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1881.

From the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the resurvey of the Mount Diablo Base Line, through Range 46 East, executed concurrently under this same Group.

N. 0° 12' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through medium undergrowth.

40.06 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
