CHAINS	<p>From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.</p> <p>N. 1° 11' E., bet. secs. 5 and 6.</p> <p>Over gently rolling land, through medium undergrowth; desc. gradually over a gentle E. slope.</p> <p>4.30 Ravine, drains ESE. from W.; continue over a gently rolling E. slope.</p> <p>37.60 Draw, drains E. approximately 2 chs., thence ESE.</p> <p>39.95 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div><div>T1N R46E</div><div>$\frac{1}{4}$</div><div>S 6 S 5</div><div>1968</div></div> <p>deposit broken glass alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.</p> <p>Asc. 50 ft. over a gradual E. slope.</p> <p>62.80 Draw, drains ESE.; asc. gradually over a gentle E. slope.</p> <p>74.70 Spur, slopes SE.; desc. over a gradual NE. slope.</p> <p>79.71 The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp.</p> <p>Land, gently rolling. 	<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within Township 1 North, Range 46 East, varies from nearly level in the southern and central portions which is a part of Cactus Flat to rolling in the western portion, on the east slope of Monitor Hills. The remaining terrain is gently rolling. The elevation ranges from about 5,300 to 5,900 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy to sandy clay loam and is rocky on the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of shadscale, budsage, blackbrush, Mormon-tea and native grasses.</p> <p>The area drains in a southerly direction through the central portion of the township. A windmill is situated in section 9 and a corral is located in section 31. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Access into the area is provided by a paved road crossing the township in a south-southeasterly direction and supplemented by numerous trail roads. Principal users of the area are cattlemen.</p>
