	<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p>
	<p>The land within Township 46 North, Range 63 East is rolling mountainous to gently rolling. The western portion is gently rolling. The elevation ranges from 5,500 ft. to 7,000 ft. above sea level. Grassy Mountain is in section 1.</p> <p>The soil varies from sandy loam and light gravel on the lower elevations to sandy gravel and rocky in the mountains. Vegetation consists of sagebrush and native grasses.</p> <p>The western portions of the township are drained by Cottonwood Creek and its tributaries. The eastern portion is drained by various washes draining into Salmon Falls Creek.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by a graded road and several trail roads.</p>
