GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 47 North, Range 64 East, is rolling and mountainous. The SW. portion is mountainous. The elevation ranges from about 5100 to 6200 ft. above sea level.

The soil consists of sandy loam in the lower elevation to sandy clay and rocky in the higher elevations.

The vegetation on the lower elevations consists mostly of sagebrush and on the higher elevations sagebrush, native grasses and cottonwood trees and willows along the creeks.

The township is drained by three main creeks. Salmon Falls Creek drains NNW. through secs. 35, 26, 23, 22, 15, 10, 3 and 4. Cottonwood Creek drains through secs. 18, 17, 8, 9 and 4 into the Salmon Falls Creek. Shoshone Creek drains through secs. 13, 24 and 23 into the Salmon Falls Creek.

The town of Jackpot is located in sections 1 and 12. There is some cultivated land in sections 13 and 24.

The principal users within the township are cattlemen and farmers. There is no mineral activity of consequence.

Access into the township is provided by U.S. Highway No. 93 and improved bladed roads.
