Chase and A. Lash, U. S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1868, and the Retracement and Partial Resurvey Executed by John G. Booker, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1902.</div> <div>Beginning the resurvey at the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with a sand- stone, 20x10x8 ins., plainly mkd. with 3 notches on the E. edge, 3 notches on the W. edge and firmly set in a small mound of earth.</div> <div>At the corner point</div> <div>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</div> <div><div>T10N R27E S 33 S 34 S 4 S 3 T9N</div><div>1968</div></div> <div>bury the original corner stone alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.</div> <div>N. 89° 21' W., bet. secs. 4 and 33.</div> <div>Over gently rolling land, through medium undergrowth; desc. 70 ft. over a gradual W. slope to the ¼ sec. cor.</div> <div>9.50 Trail road, bears SSE. and NNW.</div> <div>11.80 Trail road, bears SE. and NW.</div> <div>19.40 Trail road, bears N. and S.</div> <div>19.60 Fence, bears N. and S.</div> <div>35.00 Bottom of descent, bears N. and S.; thence over nearly level bottom land.</div> <div>39.94 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 33, at pro- portionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</div> <div>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</div>
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
