Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
Garside and Preble, U. S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1874.

Beginning at the cor. of Tps. 41 and 42 N., Rs. 21 and 22
E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., set, mkd.
and witnessed as described in the official record.

N. 0° 39' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over mountainous land, through bunch grass and scattered
sagebrush; desc. 20 ft. over a NE. slope.

- 7.30 Trail road, bears E. and W.; desc. 110 ft. over a N.
slope.
- 27.00 Ravine, drains NE.; asc. 30 ft. over a SSE. slope.
- 39.00 Low spur, slopes E.; desc. 10 ft. over a N. slope.
- 41.67 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at propor-
tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the
original corner.
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in
the ground, with brass cap mkd.
