Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to cap, 4 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.

38.95 Point for the W. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31, at 40.00 chs. in latitude from the cor. of secs. 30 and 31.
