CHAINS

Point for the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 5, is on the S. bdy. of sec. 32, T. 15 N., R. 56 E. and at midpoint on the N. bdy. of sec. 5.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to cap, 4 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 14 North, Range 56 East, ranges from about 5,800 to 6,800 ft. above sea level, and is nearly level to rolling and mountainous. The soil is sandy clay, gravel and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood and whitesage. There is scattered juniper on the higher elevations.

The Bull Creek Ranch is located in sec. 25, and the Big Bull Spring is in sec. 14.
