	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within Township 29 North, Range 69 East, ranges from about 5100 to 7000 ft. above sea level, and is gently rolling to rolling and mountainous. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and greasewood. There is scattered juniper and pinon timber on the higher elevations.</p> <p>A cabin is located in section 5.</p> <p>The township is drained by Dead Cedar Wash, which winds southeasterly through the northern portion of the township, and other minor drainages.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by Alternate U. S. Highway No. 50, through the west portion of the township, supplemented with other desert and trail roads.</p>
