Over gently rolling land, through scattered sagebrush
and native grass; desc. 50 ft. over a NW. slope.

5.90 Wash, 15 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains W.; thence over
nearly level land.

37.07 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with a
wooden post, $1\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2} \times 18$ ins., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$, and set in a mound
of earth.
