

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES OF
T. 40 N., R. 47 E.

CHAINS

From this cor., the standard cor. of secs. 34 and 35, T. 41 N., R. 47 E., bears N. 89° 48' E., 18.25 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the concurrent dependent resurvey of the Eighth Standard Parallel North, through Range 47 East.

The point for the N. ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 6, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., at proportionate distance and on the Eighth Standard Parallel North.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 40 North, Range 47 East ranges from about 5,500 to 7,000 ft. above sea level. The terrain varies from rolling to mountainous. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky.

Water is supplied by numerous springs throughout the township.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the area is provided by numerous desert and trail roads.

There are no settlements in the township.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
