From the cor. of Tps. 39 and 40 N., Rs. 48 and 49 E.,
monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., set, mkd.
and witnessed as described in the official record.

N. 0° 08' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling land, through scattered sagebrush and native
grass; desc. 110 ft. over N. slope.

19.00 Draw, drains NW.; asc. 40 ft. over SW. slope.

27.50 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 110 ft. over N. slope.

39.78 The $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with a
limestone, 20x8x6 ins., plainly mkd. $\frac{1}{2}$ on the W. face
and firmly set in a mound of stone.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
