

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES OF  
T. 40 N., R. 48 E.

CHAINS

From this corner the standard cor. of secs. 33 and 34, T. 41 N., R. 48 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the Eighth Standard Parallel North, through R. 48 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group, bears S. 87° 47' E., 18.56 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 40 North, Range 48 East, ranges from about 5,900 to 7,100 ft. above sea level, and is rolling to mountainous. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, rabbitbrush and native bunchgrass.

The township is drained by Rock Creek, which winds southerly through the eastern portion of the township and North Fork Rock Creek, which winds south through the center of the township, and Toe Jam Creek, which drains westerly through the south tier of sections, and by other minor drainages.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by numerous desert and trail roads throughout the township.
