| | <p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area surveyed along the north boundary of Township 17 North, Range 70 East, is located in mountainous terrain along the north side of Mt. Moriah. The elevations range from about 7,600 to 8,600 ft. above sea level. The soil is clayey and rocky. Vegetation consists of sagebrush, budsage, shadscale and native grasses. There are medium to heavy stands of timber consisting of mountain mahogany, juniper and pinon.</p> <p>The area is drained by Rye Grass Canyon in an easterly direction. Access to the area is by way of a graded road along the east edge of Spring Valley to Eight Mile Canyon thence along a trail road up Eight Mile Canyon into the area along the north boundary of the township. There are no residents in the area.</p> <p>No minerals nor water sources were noted.</p> |
