

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 35 N., R. 42 E.

CHAINS

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

From this corner, the standard cor. of Tps. 35 and 36 N., Rs. 41 and 42 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears S. $89^{\circ} 57' W.$, 17.40 chs. dist.

From this same corner, the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 36 N., R. 42 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears N. $89^{\circ} 57' E.$, 22.74 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within the portion of Township 35 North, Range 42 East, resurveyed herein, ranges from about 4400 feet to 4520 feet above sea level. The soil is sandy clay, sandy gravel and alkali. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, budsage, rabbitbrush and greasewood.

The resurveyed portion of the township is chiefly used for grazing. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during this survey.

Access into the township is provided by U. S. Interstate Highway No. 80 and other graded and trail roads.
