

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are situated about 18 miles northwesterly of the town of Tonopah, Nevada, in the San Antonio mining district, Nye County, Nevada. Access is by way of several unimproved dirt roads extending northeasterly from graded and gravelled State Route No. 89, at a point approximately 17 miles northwest of Tonopah.

The area drains westerly into the Big Smoky Valley. Elevations range from about 5,460 feet above sea level at the northwest township corner to about 6,580 feet above sea level on the top of a small peak on the north bounary of section 32.
