

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE WEST BOUNDARY, T. 15 S., R. 68 E.

CHAINS

N. 1° 21' W., bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over nearly level mesa top, through light greasewood.

39.68 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a collar of stone to top, with brass cap mkd.
