Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by,
E. B. Monroe and A. G. Bateman, U. S. Deputy Surveyors,
in 1871.

The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, on the E. bdy. of the
Tp., monumented with the remains of a pinon post, wired
to a steel fence post.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

N. 0° 01' W., bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over nearly level land, through shadscale and sagebrush.

40.30 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at propor-
tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the
original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
