reset the cedar post and set a steel fence post,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  ft. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ft. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 4 North, Range 60 East, is nearly level. The elevation averages about 5,200 ft. above sea level. The soil is composed of sandy clay and sandy gravel. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, budsage, greasewood, rabbitbrush and salt-grass.

The area is drained by the undefinable channel of the White River which drains in a south-easterly direction through Township 4 North, Range 61 East.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during this survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and sheepmen; there are several bands of wild horses in the area. Access into the township is provided by trail roads.
