

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE S. BDY., T. 5 N., R. 61 E.

CHAINS

S. 89° 35' W., bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Over gently rolling land, through budsage, greasewood and rabbitbrush; desc. 30 ft. over a W. slope.

18.30 Trail road, bears NNE. and SSW.

40.43 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

78.24 The cor. of Tps. 4 and 5 N., Rs. 60 and 61 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the concurrent resurvey of a portion of the east boundary of T. 4 N., R. 60 E.
