Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by E. B. Monroe,  
U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1871.

From the cor. of Tps. 6 and 7 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E.

N. 89° 54' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through sagebrush, greasewood  
and rabbitbrush.

40.21 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, monumented with a  
cedar post, 1x1x24 ins., loosely set in a mound of  
earth and plainly scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$ .

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

reset the cedar post and set a steel fence post, 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft.  
long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

N. 89° 39' W., beginning new measurement.

Over nearly level land; desc. 20 ft. over a W. slope.

29.80 Graded gravel road, bears NE. and SW.

39.86 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, determined at the  
corner of fences, bearing N. and SSW.; this point is  
locally recognized as the true corner point and is  
accepted as the best available evidence of the position  
of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
