Deputy Surveyor, in 1871.</div> <div>From the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.</div> <div>N. 0° 44' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36.</div> <div>Over nearly level land, through whitesage and sagebrush.</div> <div>9.20 Trail road, bears ENE. and WSW.</div> <div>40.46 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at propor- tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</div> <div>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</div> <div><div>T6N R61E ¼ S 35 S 36</div><div>1970</div><div>set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, 2½ ft. in the ground, alongside the iron post.</div><div>49.70 Trail road, bears NNE. and SSW.</div><div>80.92 The cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, monumented with a cedar post, 2x2x26 ins., loosely set in a mound of earth and dimly scribed.</div><div>At the corner point</div><div>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</div><div><div>T6N R61E S 26 S 25 S 35 S 36</div><div>1970</div><div>reset the cedar post and set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, 2½ ft. in the ground, alongside the iron post.</div></div><div>From the cor. of secs. 25 and 36 on the E. bdy. of the Tp.</div><div>N. 89° 21' W., bet. secs. 25 and 36.</div><div>Over nearly level land, through sagebrush and shadscale.</div></div>
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
