

## DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES OF T. 6 N., R. 61 E.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 6 North, Range 61 East, is nearly level except for Hot Creek Butte which is located in secs. 18 and 19. The elevation ranges from about 5,150 to 6,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay and sandy gravel in the lower elevations to clay, limestone and granite at the higher elevations. The timber is composed of scattered juniper in the south half of the west tier of sections. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, budsage, greasewood and rabbitbrush.

The township is drained by the White River which crosses through the township in a southwesterly direction. There are three reservoirs in the township. They are Dacey, Adams-McGill and Hay Meadow. These reservoirs provide good fishing and water fowl hunting. Hot Creek Campground is located in the SW.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 9. There are several cabins located in the NW.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 26.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during this survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen, sheepmen and sportsmen. There are several bands of wild horses in the area. Access into the township is provided by graded gravel roads and trail roads.
