

TOWNSHIP 23 NORTH, RANGE 18 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1947, and the Special Instructions dated June 11, 1970.

The geographic position of the southeast corner of the township is at latitude $39^{\circ} 48' 34.1''$ N., and longitude $119^{\circ} 54' 09.3''$ W., as adjusted through ties and section lines from U.S.G.S. triangulation station "Red Rock," located in sec. 17.

The magnetic declination was read at a number of stations throughout the township and the mean of these readings was found to be 18° east.

Retracement and Partial Remonumentation
of a Portion of the Survey Executed by
A. W. Von Schmidt, Deputy Surveyor,
in 1872.

From the 145th Mi. Cor., Nevada-California State Line, monumented with a deeply imbedded granite stone, 10 ins. square at the base and 4 ins. square at the top, exposed 3 ft. above the ground, plainly mkd. NEVADA on the east face, and CALIF on the west face in black paint on a yellow background. The entire monument is painted. The monument is considered sound and well marked and does not require remonumentation.

S. $0^{\circ} 25'$ W., along the 146th mile.

Over rolling land, through medium dense sagebrush.

- 16.20 Ravine, drains W.; asc. 60 ft. over rolling WNW. slope.
- 24.00 Low spur, slopes W.
- 26.80 Ravine, drains W.; asc. 30 ft. over NW. slope.
- 32.00 Enter mountainous land, bears NE. and SSW.; asc. 40 ft. over NW. slope.
- 63.80 Base of rock face, bears E. and WSW.; asc. 160 ft. over a rock N. face.
- 65.50 Top of rock face; asc. 120 ft. over broken WNW. slope.
- 71.80 Top of ascent on W. slope; desc. 60 ft. over rocky WSW. slope.
