		<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>Township 24 North, Range 18 East, Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada, is situated about 30 miles North of Reno, Nevada, and includes portions of Seven Lakes Mountain, Dry Valley, and Fort Sage Mountain.</p> <p>Elevations range from 4400 to 5600 feet above sea level with terrain varying from nearly level to Mountainous. Rock outcroppings are igneous and soil is largely alluvial with a clay loam in the valley. The township drains to the west through Dry Valley Creek exiting the area at the west boundary of section 7. Dry Valley Creek is an intermittent stream.</p> <p>Vegetation is comprised of native grasses, sagebrush and rabbitbrush. There are scattered juniper trees in the hilly portions of the township.</p> <p>No significant mineral sources were noted. There are no residents in the area. Principal users of the township currently include cattlemen and recreationalists.</p>
