	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	The area resurveyed within Township 33 North, Range 58 East is located on the northern slopes of the Ruby Mountain Range, varying from mountainous to gently rolling. The elevations range from about 6,000 ft. to 9,100 ft. above sea level. The soil consists of rock and clay at the higher elevations to clay loam at the lower elevations. The vegetation is comprised of sagebrush, mountain willow, buck brush and native grasses. The timber is mainly cedar and mountain mahogany with stands of pinon and aspen.
