## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within the resurveyed portion of Township 34 North, Range 60 East, varies from gently rolling to mountainous land, and is situated on the eastern slope of Secret Peak in the Ruby Mountains and extending into Secret Valley. The elevation ranges from about 6,200 to 9,100 ft. above sea level. The soil consists of sandy clay in the valley to rocky clay in the mountains. The southeast portion of sec. 5 and the northeast portion of sec. 8 is under cultivation and the remaining area has vegetation consisting of greasewood, sagebrush and native grasses; the timber is mainly aspen with scattering stands of pinon pine, mountain mahogany and pine.

Devils Slide Canyon and Mineral Spring Canyon, drains northerly through sec. 6, 7 and 18 into Secret Creek which drains northwesterly through secs. 5, 6, and 8. Poison Canyon drains northeasterly through secs. 8, 17 and 18. Gardner Creek drains northeasterly through secs. 19 and 20 into Secret Creek. Ross Creek drains northwesterly through sec. 31 and Murphy Creek drains northwesterly through sec. 30. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Access into the area is provided by State Highway No. 11 crossing through secs. 5, 6 and 8, and a number of trail roads through the area.

There is a ranch house located near the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 5.

Principal uses of the area are farming in the low lands and grazing in the mountains.
