	Descend 100 ft. over NW. slope.
44.80	Creek, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course SW.; asc. 140 ft. over SE. slope.
53.50	Spur, slopes SW.; desc. 180 ft. over W. slope.
70.50	Creek, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course S.; asc. 70 ft. over NE. slope.
80.60	The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.
	N. 1° 18' E., bet. secs. 5 and 6.  Over mountainous land, covered with sagebrush and bunchgrass; desc. 30 ft. over NE. slope.
11.00	Ravine, drains SSE.; asc. 120 ft. over S. slope.
18.00	Ridge, bears ENE. and WSW.; desc. 180 ft. over N. slope.
33.80	Lewis Creek, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course W.; asc. 100 ft. over SW. slope.
41.02	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.  Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 12 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

	Ascend 380 ft. over SW. slope.
74.90	Fence, bears E. and W. on spur sloping SSE.; desc. slightly over E. slope.
82.11	The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd. and witnessed as described in the field note record of the dependent resurvey of T. 40 N., R. 50 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group.
