CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 40 North, Range 50 East, ranges from about 6,500 to 8,600 ft. above sea level and is mostly mountainous. The soil varies from sandy clay loam and rocky on the higher elevations to black loam on the bottom land. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, buckbrush, meadow grass and other sparse native grasses. There are numerous bunches of aspen trees located on most of the north slopes.

The township is drained by Rock and Toe Jam Creeks which drain west for about 2½ miles through the township and by McCann Creek which drains south-southeast.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by numerous desert trail roads.
