40.20 Point for the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, at propor-  
tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the  
original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
