Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 6 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

20.50 Ridge, bears N. and S.; desc. 580 ft. over a W. slope.

39.43 The cor. of Tps. 38 and 39 N., Rs. 37 and 38 E.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.

N. 0° 19' E., bet. secs. 34 and 35.

Over rolling sand dunes.

15.00 Enter nearly level land, bears E. and W.

38.30 Unimproved dirt road, bears ESE. and WNW.

40.34 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 34 and 35, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
