40.13	<p>True point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. True point falls on a steep S. slope of rock outcrop where corner cannot be perpetuated. At the true point, mark a cross (X) on the surface of the rock outcrop.</p> <p>Asc. 160 ft. over a steep S. slope.</p>
45.00	Slope changes; asc. 280 ft. over a steep SW. slope.
68.50	Ridge, bears ESE. and WNW.; desc. 300 ft. over a steep N. slope.

<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within Township 38 North, Range 38 East, ranges from about 4,400 ft. to 7,400 ft. above sea level. The NW. portion is mountainous, composed of the Santa Rosa Range, the SW. portion is rolling and the eastern portion is gently rolling to nearly level land. The soil is sandy clay and rocky on the higher elevations and sandy clay on the lower elevations. The vegetation consists of cheatgrass, sagebrush and patches of scattered aspen in the higher elevation.</p> <p>The township is drained by China Garden Creek which flows southeasterly through sections 7, 8, 15, 16 and 17, and by Piute Creek which flows southeasterly through sections 17, 18, 20, 21, 22 and 27. Seep springs are found in the higher elevations.</p> <p>A natural gas pipeline, underground, crosses the township from SW. to NE. U. S. Highway No. 95 crosses the township from S. to N. An abandoned highway roughly parallels U. S. Highway No. 95. Further access to the area is provided by bladed and trail roads.</p> <p>No mining deposits of value were noted and the principal users of the township are cattlemen.</p>
