

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES OF  
T. 39 N., R. 38 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA.

CHAINS	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	<p>The land within Township 39 North, Range 38 East ranges from about 4,000 ft. to 7,400 ft. above sea level. The western portion is mountainous and is called the Santa Rosa Range and Bloody Run Hills, and the central portion is gently rolling to nearly level land. The soil is sandy loam and rocky on the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, sparse native grasses and patches of scattered aspen in the higher elevations.</p> <p>The township is drained by Cottonwood Creek crossing the southern part, Paradise Canyon crossing the central part, Asa Moore Canyon crossing the northern part and the remainder draining easterly into the valley. There are two water wells in section 34 and seep springs in the higher elevations.</p> <p>An abandoned mining operation is situated in section 19. No other mining activity was noted. The principal users of the township are cattlemen.</p> <p>An underground natural gas pipeline crosses the area from SW. to NE. A house is located in section 34, another house is located in section 3 and in section 3, alongside the highway, there is a small business establishment.</p> <p>U. S. Highway No. 95 crosses the area from S. to N. An abandoned highway roughly parallels the U. S. Highway. Further access in the township is provided by bladed and trail roads.</p>
