	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>Township 21 North, Range 35 East is situated in Dixie Valley about seventy miles northeast of Fallon, Nevada. The land, except the extreme southeast portion, which is broken and mountainous, is slightly rolling to nearly level land. The elevation ranges from about 3,200 ft. to 4,700 ft. above sea level. The soil on the lower land is sandy in the southern portion and alkali in the northern portion. The soil on the higher land is rocky and gravelly. The vegetation is comprised of greasewood and native grasses.</p> <p>The township is drained by numerous small washes in a northwesterly direction into Dixie Valley. Springs are located in sections 2, 11 and 22. Ponds are located in sections 9 and 11. Wells with windmills are located in sections 24 and 31. Artesian water is obtainable in the northwest portion for irrigation purposes. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>A small community is located in the northwest portion of this township. The township is primarily used by the local farmers for growing crops and raising cattle.</p> <p>Access in the township is provided by several gravel, bladed and trail roads branching from a main gravel road which leads from U. S. Highway No. 50.</p>
