extending 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

Over mountainous land, through scattered pinon and  
juniper; desc. 30 ft. over NE. slope.

- 5.20 Ravine, drains NNW.; asc. 100-ft. over SW. slope.
- 18.00 Spur, projects NW.; desc. 120 ft. over NE. slope.
- 24.60 Draw, drains WNW.; asc. 20 ft. over SW. slope.
- 29.40 Spur, projects W.; desc. 60 ft. over NW. slope.
- 35.80 Head of draw, drains W.; asc. 40 ft. over SW. slope.
- 39.53 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at propor-  
tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the  
original corner.
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 6 ins.  
in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft.  
base to top, with brass cap mkd.
