	<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>Township 19 North, Range 37 East lies mainly in Edwards Creek Valley, about 40 miles west of Austin, Nevada. The elevation ranges from about 5,200 ft. to about 7,600 ft. above sea level. The soil is clay to sandy clay in the valley, and rocky clay on the slopes.</p> <p>General drainage is to Edwards Creek, which drains NNE. through the NE. portion of the Tp. Water flow in Edwards Creek is seasonal. Cherry Creek enters the township just east of the corner of secs. 5 and 6, on the north boundary, flowing southeasterly. Most of the water in Cherry Creek is used by the Clan Alpine Ranch, located in sec. 4, and the remainder of the water disappears before leaving the township.</p> <p>An abandoned mining operation is located in the northwest corner of sec. 19. The ruins of Clan Alpine are located in the southeast corner of sec. 5. No other mining activity of any consequence was noticed.</p> <p>The Alpine Ranch, which is abandoned, is located in sec. 28. Clan Alpine Ranch, a livestock operation, is located in sec. 4. The S. $\frac{1}{2}$ of sec. 11 and the E. $\frac{1}{2}$ of sec. 12 are under cultivation. There are several irrigation wells located on these parcels.</p> <p>U. S. Highway No. 50 enters the township on the south boundary of sec. 33, and leaves on the east boundary of sec. 13. Other access to the township is provided by numerous trail roads and several improved dirt roads.</p>
