

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES OF  
T. 20 N., R. 38 E.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 20 North, Range 38 East, lies mostly in Edwards Creek Valley and ranges from about 5,100 to 6,000 ft. above sea level. The land is nearly level except in the northwestern portion of sec. 6 which is mountainous terrain. The soil varies from sandy to clay loam. A portion of sec. 32 is under cultivation and the remaining area has vegetation consisting of greasewood, sagebrush and bunchgrass. There are stands of pine timber in the northwestern portion of sec. 6.

The area drains into a dry lake bed which is in the northeastern portion of the township. There is a spring located in sec. 19 and Edwards Creek which is dry, drains in a northeasterly direction into the dry lake bed. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Access into the area is provided by U. S. Highway No. 50 and supplemented by numerous trail roads. The principal use of the area is ranching and farming.
