## CHAINS

The point for the N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 6, is at proportionate distance on the N. bdy. of sec. 6 and on the Mount Diablo Base Line.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, 5 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

From this cor., the standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 1 N., R. 67 E., bears S.  $89^{\circ} 10'$  W., 7.61 chs. dist.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 1 South, Range 68 East, which lies North of Panaca and SE. of Pioche, varies from rolling in the south portion to mountainous in the north portion, with numerous canyons through the township. The elevation ranges from about 4,700 to 6,000 ft. above sea level.

The soil ranges from sandy clay loam in the southeast to rocky in the northwest. Parts of secs. 13, 32 and 33 are under cultivation and the remaining area has vegetation consisting of sagebrush and scattered juniper trees. The area drains in a southerly direction through the central part of the township. The Union Pacific Railroad enters the township in sec. 32 and leaves in sec. 1. U. S. Highway No. 93 enters the township in sec. 32 and leaves in sec. 5. Cathedral Gorge State Park is located in secs. 30 and 31.

There are numerous access roads in the township branching from U. S. Highway No. 93. Principal use of the area is ranching and farming.
