The soil is sandy clay and gravelly. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood and bunchgrass. There are scattered juniper and pinon throughout the township of little commercial value.</p> <p>The township is drained by various washes, draws and ravines. The southerly portion of the township drains southeasterly and the northerly portion of the township drains in a northeasterly direction.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are sheep ranchers and access is provided by numerous trail roads.</p>
