The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood and sparse native grasses. There is scattered juniper throughout the township,
	which is of little commercial value.
	The area is drained only by dry washes winding easterly through the township.
	There are numerous surveyed mining claims in the north portion of the township which is known as the Ferber Mining District.
	Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved desert and trail roads.

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
